## Local Language & Culture (Gunditimara) Learning

So far this term in Local Language and Culture, our Grade 4/5 students have been exploring the rich storytelling traditions of the Gunditjmara People. We learned about the importance of Dreamtime stories—how they explain the creation of the land, the animals, and the deep spiritual connections that First Nations communities share with Country.

After reading and discussing several traditional stories, students worked together to plan, write, and illustrate their very own Dreamtime picture storybooks. They carefully considered the lessons each story teaches, the characters that shape the narrative, and the ways the land itself becomes part of the story.

Students then published their stories using both artwork and digital images to bring their creations to life.

Throughout the process, the class reflected on:

- The significance of storytelling in Aboriginal cultures
- The connections between Dreamtime stories and the Gunditjmara landscape
   How stories can teach respect, responsibility,

We are incredibly proud of the creativity, care, and cultural awareness shown by all students.


#### Exploring Walking the Boundaries and Indigenous Foods

## **Holiday Maths Made Fun!**

#### **How Parents Can Support Maths Learning This Summer**

The summer holidays are a fantastic time for children to relax, explore and learn in natural, playful ways. Maths is all around us, and with a little creativity, families can help keep important skills ticking over without it feeling like schoolwork. Here are some simple and fun ideas to try at home or on holiday:

#### 1. Bake and Create

Cooking is full of maths! Let your child measure ingredients, set timers and compare amounts. Ask questions like, "What happens if we double the recipe?" or "How many cupcakes will we have if we share them evenly?"

#### 2. Shopping Shenanigans

Turn a trip to the shops into a maths adventure. Children can help read prices, compare costs, count items, or estimate the total before you get to the checkout.

#### 3. Car Journey Challenges

Long drive? Play number-spotting games! Look for patterns on licence plates, count red cars, or estimate how many kilometres until you reach your destination.

#### 4. Outdoor Maths Moments

At the beach or park, encourage your child to look for shapes in nature, measure sticks or footprints, count shells, or time how long it takes to run between two points.

#### 5. Board Games and Puzzles

Card games, dice games, dominoes and jigsaw puzzles all build logic, counting and problem-solving skills—plus they're great family fun.

#### 6. Real-Life Problem Solvers

Ask your child to help with everyday tasks: "How many cups will we need if Grandma comes for dinner?" or "Can you split this snack evenly between everyone?"

With just a few small activities sprinkled throughout the holidays, children can keep their maths skills fresh while having fun at the same time. Happy summer exploring!

## Safe Migration


Make your child's active journey to primary school a safe one.

Whether your family walks, cycles, scoots, or drives, there are simple steps we can all take to make every journey safer.



# Is Your Child Starting School at Heywood Consolidated School in 2026?






